Sailing school report

Hi all,

I have several new initiatives to write about in this issue of Sandbar. Some are targeted at Adults who have finished their Start Sailing 1 and 2 courses or new sailors at the Club; while others are targeted at either adults or development squad coaching participants who are interested in getting into Club Racing. The underlying aim of these initiatives is to increase the numbers of members sailing at the Club and to try to ensure they have fun in doing so.

Saturday Sailing for Adults:

While we will still have Club Racing on a Sunday afternoon, we want to make sailing for adults on a Saturday a real focus for those who do not want to race. We already have our Adult Start Sailing 1 and 2 courses on a Saturday from 9:00 until 2:00 and last summer we began to get a group of adults together who were interested in coaching sessions from 3:00 until 5:30. This year, we have scheduled 18 sessions of Adult Coaching starting on Saturday November 4th and running through until Saturday April 6th with a short break over the Christmas/New Year period. The idea of these sessions is to sail a set on water activity together and get feedback on your sailing while on the water from a Coach/Instructor to help improve your sailing skills. There will also be the opportunity to get feedback about your boat set up and making sure it is suitable for the conditions on the day. There will be one or two safety boats on the water depending on numbers each day. The cost for these is \$100 for four sessions if using a Club boat or \$50 for four sessions if using your own boat. These do not need to be sequential sessions and can be paid one day at a time if you prefer.

If you just want to social sail with other Adults on a Saturday and not take part in the coaching sessions, you can check when the coaching sessions are on in the program and know that there will be at least one safety boat on the water when you are sailing. The best part of sailing with others on the water is having a chat about your sail once you return to the beach. We want to encourage adults to sail socially on a Saturday afternoon to help build this social contact with other sailors. We know that a number of people are concerned about "getting in the way of those racing" on a Sunday afternoon, but this is not a problem on Saturdays. Please take advantage of this opportunity to build your social connection with other sailors, you will enjoy sailing more with other boats out on the water at the same time.

Getting started in Club Racing:

This is another area that we can do better. Quite a few people who have not raced before are anxious about joining in with Club Racing. Will I get in the way of others? How do I find my way around the course? Will I be embarrassed if I get lost on the course or get too far behind? Starting racing is a big step, especially for those who have just joined the Club or just learned to sail. This option is available for both adults and younger sailors.

We are suggesting two options for those who would like to try racing, but need a little help to take that step:

- One is that we have a few people who can offer to go out with you in a two person boat (either your own or a Club Pacer or RS Quest) and sail a race with you so that you can become familiar with the start sequence, the start process and sailing the course. If you would like to do this, please talk to either myself, Peter Kinsman or John Dunn to make this happen. Please try to do this at least the day before the event to make arranging the details easier.
- The other option is to arrange for one of us to follow you closely around the course in an extra safety boat (Northerly or Lucky Duck) to give you advice about what is happening and what

to do. Again, we would like at least a full days' notice before this event arrange for this to happen. Preferably ask myself or Peter Kinsman if you would like to do this.

Taking the step to start racing can be quite daunting, if one of these options would help you and you would like to start racing, please just ask. Again, I will stress that one of the best things about sailing with others, whether you race or not is to be able to have a chat after sailing with those who were on the water with you.

Next in my article for this Sandbar is to list the Sailing School courses to be run for the summer and their starting dates:

Adult Learn to Sail Courses – starting dates are November 4th, January 13th and February 24th.

Tackers 1, 2 and 3 (7 to 11 year olds) – starting November 5th and January 28th. We may run a course in early January if there is enough interest.

OutThere Sailing (12 to 17 year olds) – starting November 4th and January 27th. We will also have a three day course in January starting on Tuesday January 16th.

Saturday Development Squad Coaching – starting October 14th.

Sunday development Squad Coaching – starting October 15th.

Adult Coaching / Adult Saturday Social Sailing – starting November 4th.

We will also be running:

- Powerboat Handling courses
- Safety Boat Operator courses
- Windsurfing courses
- FoilLabs
- Learn to Wing courses
- Learn to Wing Foil courses
- Stand Up Paddle Board lessons

These will be run when we have enough people interested and then where we can fit them in to the program.

If you are interested in any of these, **please send an email ASAP to confirm your interest**. We do already have quite a few enrolments in these courses so please let us know as soon as possible.

I am also doing a "try windsurfing" activity on both the Saturday and Sunday of the last weekend in October when we are running the Windsurfer LT State Championships. If you want to have a try at windsurfing, this will run from 12:30 to 4:00 on each day – weather permitting. You just need to turn up on the day with some wet weather gear. It is a free activity.

I have already run our first Powerboat Handling Course for the summer with six people doing the theory and seven doing the on water training. That was a long nine hour day out on the water for me made extra-long because we had to launch and retrieve Westerly from the boat ramp – the tractor was still away for repairs. We do already have a few people interested in the next one. For many of the courses listed without a starting date, they will run on Saturday afternoons in the 3:00 until 5:30 timeslot. I also have some time in January to slot in a few extra courses.

If you have not already done so, check out our newest toy – go to the front page of the Club website and click on to the link at the top for the Club YouTube page. I mentioned the blow cart in the last Sandbar, but since then I have been able to sail it on the beach in decent wind. The two videos with

the smaller mainly red sail, the wind was 30 knots plus. Having a 4.7 metre sail made it quite easy to control although I did tip it over once when the sail got caught on the steering handle. That day was a lot of mucking around and changing minor set up issues including moving the sail up a bit after the capsize to prevent the same thing happening again.

The following day the wind was down to around 13 to 15 knots, but there was a wider stretch of beach. I put on a 5.5 metre sail (mainly green) and sailed up and down for well over half an hour and kept out of the water most of the time. *Absolutely awesome fun*. Thanks to Peter, John and Mark for their work in putting the cart together. It really will be a winter toy as you need a clear beach to be safe, but as I said – *awesome fun!*

Lastly I need to thank you to everyone who has helped to run everything and participate in the Sailing School programs last summer. It is a great team effort and we were able to win the Discover Sailing Centre of the Year at the Victorian State Australian Sailing Awards held a few weeks ago. This is an incredible effort from everyone. We have now won that award three times in eight years.

Hopefully we will see many of you on the water next Sunday. I am looking forward to a long hot summer.

Around the Club News by Peter Kinsman

Changes to marine regulations - June 2023

The Victorian Government has introduced the Marine Safety Regulations 2023 to improve safety for Victorian boaters.

The new regulations apply from June 11, 2023 and replace the now expired Marine Safety Regulations 2012.

A summary of the changes is below.

The following changes now apply for lifejacket use in Victoria:

In situations where children are always required to wear life jackets, the age limit has changed from 'less than 10 years old', to 'less than 12 years' old.

A sole adult boating with children less than 12yo is considered boating alone and must comply with the heightened risk provisions that apply to boating alone.

Mandatory lifejacket wear applies in times of heightened risk,

Australian standards are to be the only recognized standard for lifejackets in Victoria. This change will apply from July 1 2028.

The new regulations replace references to 'personal flotation device' with the common term 'lifejacket'.

Marine flares

The regulations introduce an option for vessels operating on **enclosed waters** to carry one of the following **in place of pyrotechnic distress flares**:

- a Global Positioning System (GPS) enabled Emergency Position Indicating Radio Beacon (EPIRB), or
- Personal Locator Beacon (PLB), or
- VHF marine radio with a minimum 25-watt output (i.e. not a handheld)

Marine Radios

27MHz radios no longer meet the definition of marine radios. Marine radios must be ACMA-approved VHF radios.

Navigation lights

There is a new infringement for installing navigation lights incorrectly, including having navigation lights installed incorrectly during daylight hours. This means that if **you have navigation lighted fitted**, they must be fully operational, **even during daylight**.

Sails stored at RYC

The sails stored at the Club are becoming hard to keep track of.

To address this, the Executive Committee has purchased plastic tags that can be written on. We will have these available in the changerooms, along with a permanent marker.

When you next take your sails down, please attach one of the yellow tags and write your Sail number on the tag. You can also write your name if you wish.

The tags are stored in the document pockets in the garage.

Please do not insert the tie into the label until you are placing on your bag, as they cannot be removed once inserted.

In time, we will be able to check for any sails that are not being used.



SUP Storage Cabinets

A reminder that the SUP cupboards are protected by a monitored alarm system and if you need to access the SUP Cabinet, please reminder to turn the alarm off before opening the doors. The red LED above the keypad will be lit if the alarm is on.
