

Sailing school report

Hi all,

As you may have noticed, through November our weather has been up and down like a yoyo. While September was warm and mostly dry, October was either quite windy or almost nothing and during November we have had a lot of rain to throw into the weather pattern. They promised us a hot dry summer so I hope we see a significant change in December. Even on the weekend when we hosted the Windsurfer LT State Championships, we had one day that was too windy for course racing and the following day there was next to no wind in the morning and a little more in the afternoon.

All our normal courses, Tackers, OutThere Sailing, both Development Squad groups, Adult Learn to Sail and Adult Coaching are well under way although most groups have had some time when they have not been able to sail due to the weather patterns. Even changes during the day have meant that a group in the morning may be able to sail and the after lunch group has had no wind. Last Saturday, the OutThere group sailed in a light breeze in the morning and the Development Squad in the afternoon had a try at sailing after lunch but finished up the session on the sea biscuit in absolutely no wind.

Our Development Squad numbers are up from last year, with the Tackers, OutThere Sailing and Adult Learn to Sail down a little. We will be scheduling another Powerboat Handling course in January and hopefully both Windsurfing and Wing Foiling courses in January as well.

We have recently purchased another Wind Foiling set up with a 145L, six foot JP board a Cabrinha foil a similar size to our other one and a 6 metre wing. This gives us a good range of wing sizes for a range of conditions. A couple of weeks ago, when racing was cancelled, Kai went out on the older board with a 5 metre sail in 30 knots of wind. You can see how he went on the YouTube channel video "Nice Kai." He had a great time and sailed really well. We are still learning as a group about gear set up, Kai had the wing inflated more than we usually do and this helped in the stronger wind.

While mentioning the YouTube channel, a number of videos, mainly from this summer, have been posted, mostly edited by Karl, Scott or Mick Russell. Have a look at these if you have not already, they are a great way to help promote the Club to the public. There is some great footage of the Windsurfers, some of the "blowcart" another of Opening Day and a great one of Elandra snorkelling with the spider crabs last summer.

While mentioning the blow cart, thanks to Peter, John and Mark who put the cart together from some plans that Peter was able to get hold of. It really came about after Scott had brought down a skate board that we had mounted a windsurfer sail on. Scot, Karl and I had had some fun on a few North wind days earlier in winter. The North wind and an empty beach are the most important factors to sail with either the skate board or the "blowcart." In actual fact, our land yacht is not really a blowcart – Blowcart is actually a class of land yacht. While ours is somewhat similar, the Blowcart class has a more effective mainsheet system which runs through 3 or 4 blocks on the foot of the sail. The Blowcart Class have recorded a top speed of over 140 kph. We have not been anywhere near that, but we have used our land yacht with both the OutThere Sailing group and the Saturday Development Squad groups when it was too windy for on water sailing.

My best time on the water with any group this season has been with last Sunday mornings Development Squad, supervising the OpenBICs and Minnows sailing. We had Tom Martin and Alex Ihara sailing Minnows and Pippa Hart, Josh Martin and Banjo Elliot-Wilson sailing BICs. Most of the bigger boats did not stay out for too long and the two Minnows went in before the BICs. However, Pippa, Josh and Banjo stayed out and blasted backwards and forwards on a beam reach for ages. They did have a swim or two each, but they all had a ball in sixteen to eighteen knots of breeze. It was really great to watch them have so much fun.

On the same day, the Tackers 2 and 3 sailors sailed out to the 5 knot marks with the cut down sails on the Optis. It is great that we have this option to keep them on the water in stronger winds. While there is theory that needs to be covered in the course, keeping them on the water in most conditions is certainly what we want to do.

Also, on the same day Kai, Chris and Declan took a windsurfer out with a 5 metre sail. This was on one of our SUP boards that has a centreboard to make windsurfing easier. By this time, I had taken a wind reading with the eighteen to twenty knot winds continuing, but with gusts reaching 25 knots only 250 metres from the beach.

Unfortunately, it was the day we had chosen to run a Discover Sailing Day. Not much sailing was done during this event other than Sally and Niamh taking a number of potential Tackers sailors in an Opti with a cut down sail. We did have quite a few people interested in both Tackers and Adult Learn to Sail courses. In fact one family had already joined the Club before Jean and I got home.

It has been very busy with Scott Watson running a Windsurfing Instructors Course last weekend. Both Scott and the course participants were very complimentary about the casual, friendly atmosphere of our Club. Scott specifically asked Australian Sailing to run the course at Rye after running one here last summer. We have the equipment to support this and everyone at the Club is always most helpful.

With Christmas fast approaching we will have a short break over the Christmas / New Year period for most of our courses. Don't forget that you can still come to the Club and sail during this time. We have Summer Green Fleet scheduled during the morning on seven days during this time. This is meant to be a fun event for younger sailors. Most people in Tackers 2 or 3 or in the OutThere sailing group or either Development Squad group can easily sail well enough to join in with Summer Green Fleet. Check your sailing Program in the back of your Sailing School Handbook for dates. If you want to sail on other days, just send me an email including when you want to sail and what boat you want to sail in. Preferably do this the day before you want to sail.

Last week the Sailing School was lucky enough to again receive sponsorship from the Bendigo Community Bank. This continues the sponsorship we have had for over 10 years and helps to subsidise the sailing scholarships we give to Rye Primary School students as well as other equipment.

I hope to see you on the water many times through December and January. May the hot dry summer bring us great sailing conditions.




